California First State To Ban 4 Chemicals in Foods

Starting in 2027, California will prohibit red dye 3, potassium bromate, brominated vegetable oil, and propylparaben. Entities will be prohibited from manufacturing, distributing, selling, or holding any product that has any of these four chemicals. These four chemicals are normally found in some brands of orange soda, icing, hamburger rolls, candies, and processed foods. Although the law doesn't take effect until 2027, restaurants should bear this update in mind when entering supply agreements, particularly when negotiating duration and volume commitments. Paying Employees When Faced With Natural Disasters

When natural disasters strike, such as fires, floods, hurricanes, etc., and employees cannot work because of them, restaurants are faced with numerous employment-related issues that require immediate attention. These include how to pay non-exempt and exempt employees, and how to address leaves of absence, accommodations, benefits, WARN, and OSHA, among other things. More information can be found here.

Corporate Update: Transactions Are on the Menu

The restaurant industry generally outperformed expectations through the first half of 2023 and industry experts are cautiously optimistic about the remainder of the year. Operators looking to make an acquisition in the restaurant industry will need to put heightened focus on supply chain diligence, understanding third-party delivery cost structures, and assessing wage and hour practices.

Seventh Circuit Has Beef with McDonald's Franchise Agreements

The Seventh Circuit <u>recently</u> reinstated an antitrust complaint against McDonald's, holding that former employees sufficiently alleged that the chain's franchise agreements included an employee no-poach provision—wherein employers agree not to hire or solicit each other's employees—which constituted a per se violation of Section 1 of the Sherman Act. Restaurants that have adopted a franchise model should review their agreements for antitrust compliance in light of this decision. The case is <u>Deslandes v. McDonald's USA, LLC</u>, 2023 WL 5496957 (7th Cir. Aug. 25, 2023).

FTC Enforcement Priorities Should Inform Marketing Strategy

Out of concern that AI can be used to "turbocharge fraud and scams," the Federal Trade Commission has recently announced its intent to use its "full range of tools to identify and address unfair methods of competition" facilitated by AI. In particular, a primary area of concern for the FTC is how AI can be used to generate fake consumer reviews, an issue that has been high on the FTC's priority list as it works to curtail fake endorsements and testimonials.
